What is Rainwater Harvesting?

Rainwater harvesting is the process of capturing rain and making the most of it as close as possible to where it falls. By harvesting rainwater on-site it is possible to control erosion, reduce flooding, and minimize water pollution. Earthworks (graded soil) are some of the easiest, least expensive, and most effective ways to passively harvest and conserve water in the soil. Plants help to absorb water, reduce flooding, and improve water and air quality while providing beauty, food, shelter, and wildlife habitat.

Although rainwater harvesting has been accomplished by humans in virtually every drought vulnerable region of the world for millennia, our society seems to have a collective amnesia about the utility, efficiency, and beauty of rainwater harvesting practices.
